Mary - Undoer of Knots

Dear members and supporters of the Marian Blessing Circle, I am very pleased to bring you the ecclesiastical word in this newsletter. Today, I want to focus on the famous painting "Maria der Knotenlöserin" – Mary, Undoer of Knots.

It was painted around 1700, you can find it in the church St. Peter am Perlach in Augsburg (Germany): Mary patiently, serenely and calmly unties knots out of a long white ribbon, an angel on her left side presents the knotted ribbon



to her, while another angel on her right side presents the ribbon freed from knots. The Mother of God as the Undoer of Knots is a splendid and unique representation which invites us to a deep contemplation.

The painting lives from its lighting conditions: Mary glimmers in the bright light of heavenly glory – surrounded by angelic choruses - and protected by the light of the Holy Spirit represented as a dove overshadowing Mary. Mary clearly recognizes heaven because she lives in Gods contemplation. And as our Mother she remains by our side, she intercedes for us and provides us the blessing of God. And this is represented in the painting: Mary is active for us and committed in God's redemptive action. Mary is interested in \rightarrow

our preoccupations and desires. The human being plays an important role in the painting, then underneath the Mother of God and under the clouds there is a color discontinuity. The color turns darker and sad. At the bottom, amidst the darkness, a person is guided by an angel towards a church on the top of a mountain – and there, the color is clear and bright once again.

In the painting of "Mary, the Undoer of Knots", I particularly acknowledge the yearning and ingenuous supplication to take refuge in Mary. She helps us to solve the perplexities and knots of life to return step by step from darkness to light. Yes, in my life there are things which are entangled and knotted. Things tying and confusing me, which don't let me go and paralyze me, which make me feel sick. Not everything is easy and relaxed, a knot may arise due to a dispute, due to a insuperable blow of fate or due to an encounter or incident which chases and oppresses me. Sometimes it is a battle to evade, accept and endure the knots of life. With the gaze fixed on the heavenly Mother I request for patience when I try to order and disentangle my knots – then I will not be able to achieve it with pressure and violence. Mary by my side helps me and grapes the ribbon with me, especially where there is no chance for me to continue. She patiently helps us to untie our knots.

The knots in our lives don't disappear by their own, this would be unrealistic. The paint wants to broaden my view towards my life and towards my faith in God. In confidence Mary lives already for me! So, this representation of the Virgin, the Undoer of Knots is the representation of my life: The way from darkness and uncertainty to the light and heavenly joy.

With this in mind I beg for the intercession of the Mother of God and recommend the prayer of Mary, the Undoer of Knots, which you will find below.
