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## The year of Saint Joseph

Dear members of the Marian Blessing Circle!

Pope Francis commemorates the 150th anniversary of the proclamation of Saint Joseph as patron of the universal Church and announces the "Year of Saint Joseph", ending on 8 December 2021.

In the days when Rome was occupied, the First Vatican Council had to be suspended and the Papal States became part of the Italian State through war and revolution, Pope Pius IX proclaimed Saint Joseph as patron of the Church on 8 December 1870. "After Marv, the Mother of God, no saint is mentioned more frequently in the papal magisterium than Joseph, her spouse", Pope Francis writes in his apostolic letter "Patris Corde" (With paternal heart) dated 8 December 2020. "My Predecessors



reflected on the message contained in the limited information handed down by the Gospels in order to appreciate more fully his central role in the history of salvation." In addition to the title of patron of the Church, Pope Pius XII gave Saint Joseph the title "Patron of Workers", Pope John XXIII included his name in the first Consecration of the Eucharist, Pope John Paul II described him as the "Guardian of the Savior", Pope Benedict XIV included his name also

in the other three Consecrations and the believing people invoke him for a good death.

### But, what is the reason for proclaiming the Joseph's Year?

The Pope answers: "My desire to do so increased during these months of pandemic, when we experienced, amid the crisis, how "our lives are woven together and sustained by ordinary people, people often overlooked. People who do not appear in newspaper and magazine headlines, or on the latest television show, yet in these very days are surely shaping the decisive events of our history." And Joseph is one of those silent helpers who assist their fellow people. "Each of us can discover in Joseph – the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence – an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble. Saint Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation. A word of recognition and of gratitude is due to them all", commended Pope Francis. Let's join this multitude: Praying for and blessing our neighbors, especially the sick, their relatives and the care personnel is also a silent service.

To this silent service may the Almighty God bless + and protect you through the intercession of Saint Joseph in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.
