The Eucharistic Blessing

Dear members of the Marian Blessing Circle!

The feast of CORPUS CHRISTI was a special trigger for Eucharistic devotion.

St. Juliana of Liège (1192–1258) saw in mystical visions that a feast was lacking in the Church year for the special veneration of the "living body of the LORD" (Corpus Christi). With perseverance she obtained the introduction of this feast in 1246 in the diocese of Liège in Belgium. The archdeacon of Liège, Jacques Pantaléon, became Pope Urban IV in 1261. On August 11, 1264, he extended the CORPUS CHRISTI feast to the univer-

sal Church with the Bull Transiturus. The feast was associated with a procession for the first time in the city of Cologne, Germany. The Church celebrates the permanent presence of JESUS CHRIST in the sacrament of the altar, according to the promise of JESUS in Matthew 28:20: "Behold, I am with you always, even to the end of the world."

Influenced by CORPUS CHRISTI, the Eucharistic or Sacramental Blessing is born.

This blessing is known to be given by the priest or deacon. In a monstrance (Latin *monstrare*/show) a consecrated host is shown behind glass. CHRIST, Who is truly, really, and

essentially present in the Blessed Sacrament of the Altar with Body and Blood, is "displayed" so that we can see and adore HIM. After a devotion or during a procession, the priest or deacon blesses the faithful with the monstrance. He makes the sign of the cross with the monstrance. We cross ourselves at the same time.

When we receive the Eucharistic Blessing, CHRIST blesses us.

When we receive the Sacramental Blessing, it is not a priestly blessing, but Christ blesses us. That is why the festive vestments with the blessing velum. That is why incense and altar bells. We can believe that Jesus looks at us personally and blesses us. Those who have been to the Marian shrine of Lourdes know the grace of the Eucharistic Blessing, especially during the daily blessing of the sick. Here the sick are blessed individually or in small groups with the Blessed Sacrament. Healings have been proven to occur here. Christ blesses. Your faith has helped you. Go in peace!

Bread from heaven You have given them.

So sings the priest or deacon before giving the blessing. This phrase indicates that it is not earthly bread, but Jesus in the transformed host that is given to us for salvation. "Having all sweetness within it", we respond. Jesus is, after all, our joy and our salvation. He refreshes us. And the priest or deacon sings the Oration: Lord Jesus Christ, you gave us the Eucharist as the memorial of your suffering and death. May our worship of this sacrament of your body and blood help us to experience the salvation you won for us and the peace of the kingdom where you live and reign for ever and ever. Amen.

This closes the circle: because this prayer for the Eucharistic Blessing is also the daily prayer of the Feast of Corpus Christi.

Greetings and blessings to all in the name of the + FATHER and the + SON and the + HOLY SPIRIT! Amen.

May 2023: We pray that Church movements and groups may rediscover their mission of evangelisation each day, placing their own charisms at the service of needs in the world.
