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Mary, Mother of Graces

Dear members of the Marian Blessing Circle!

Ave Maria, gratia plena, we pray with the angel: Hail Mary, full of grace.

On behalf of the Most High, the Archangel Gabriel addresses the young girl Mary and says: "Hail Mary, full of grace" (Luke 1:28). The name Mary is replaced by the angel with the new name "Blessed", literally: "full of grace". Why? Mary has been full of grace since time immemorial. That is why she said to St. Bernadette, the visionary girl of Lourdes, "I am the Immaculate Conception." Mary is not only immaculately conceived, that is, she was preserved from original sin, but her whole being is sinless and full of divine grace. ,Since grace is a free gift of divine love and favour, Mary is the one who became and lives from the free gift of divine love. Therefore she is an indescribable beloved and lover. She may, \rightarrow therefore, be praised as the Mother of beautiful love, but also as the Mother of grace., (from Josef Dillersberger, Luke - 1st volume Mary).

Full of grace: Mary, having given her YES to God, receives in her womb the grace of God, Jesus Christ. That is why we call her "Mother of Grace". As the Mother of God, she is the bearer of grace. In Old High German, "grace" means to lean down. Just as a mother or father bends down in love to look into the eyes of the child. So God in Jesus bends down full of love to look at us.
